## Celestial Highlights in 2007

- **February 10 - Saturn at Opposition.** The ringed planet will be at its closest approach to Earth. This is the best time to view and photograph Saturn and its moons.
- **March 3 - Total Lunar Eclipse.** The eclipse will be visible throughout most of the Americas, Europe, Africa, and Asia.
- **March 19 - Partial Solar Eclipse.** The partial eclipse will be visible throughout most of Asia and Alaska. (NASA Map and Eclipse Information | NASA Eclipse Animation)
- **March 21 - First Day of Spring.** The Vernal Equinox occurs in the northern hemisphere at 00:07 UT. There will be equal amounts of day and night.
- **June 6 - Jupiter at Opposition.** The giant planet will be at its closest approach to Earth. This is the best time to view and photograph Jupiter and its moons.
- **June 21 - First Day of Summer.** The Summer Solstice occurs in the northern hemisphere at 18:06 UT. The Sun is at its highest point in the sky and it will be the

## ASTRONOMY COURSE BEGINS JANUARY 13 AT SGNC

Make plans now to participate in a 3-part observational astronomy course to be held at Sugar Grove Nature Center on three successive Saturday evenings during January. The course is intended primarily for adults, but is open to youths 12 years of age and older with an accompanying adult. The main themes of the course will be solar system objects, deep space objects, and how to use a telescope. Those wishing to learn how to use their own telescopes may bring them along to obtain specialized instruction after class.

The lead instructor will be Carl Wenning, former director at the ISU Planetarium. Other qualified members of the Twin City Amateur Astronomers will assist with the teaching of this

course, and help those who bring along their own telescopes learn how to use them.

Classes will take place on three successive Saturday evenings, January 13, 20, and 27, 2007. Class activities begin at 7:00 p.m. sharp and will continue through 9:00 p.m. each evening even if the sky is cloudy. In the event of inclement weather or poor road conditions, the class will be postponed. Phone Carl between 5 and 6 p.m. at (309) 830-4085 if road and weather conditions are of concern.

A supplemental telescope observing session will take place following each class if the sky is clear. Members of the astronomy club will assist with observing sessions, and will help instruct class members in the use of their own telescopes – so bring yours along if you have one.

A registration and materials fee will be collected the

first night of class. The fee is \$20 per person for the general public, and \$17 for members of SGNC. If no instructional materials are desired, the fees will be \$13 and \$10 respectively.

Registration for this course is required, and may be completed by contacting Sugar Grove Nature Center by phone (309) 874-2174 or email - [sugargrovenc@earthlink.net](mailto:sugargrovenc@earthlink.net) by January 5, 2007. Let us know the names of all participants in your party, and whether or not materials are desired. Fees will be collected at the first class. Register early if you wish to attend. Last year the course filled to over-flowing, and a number of individuals had to be turned away.

- longest day of the year.
- **August 13 - Neptune at Opposition.** The blue planet will be at its closest approach to Earth. This is the best time to view Neptune, although it will only appear as a tiny blue dot in all but the most powerful telescopes.
- **August 28 - Total Lunar Eclipse.** The eclipse will be visible throughout most of eastern Asia, Australia, the Pacific Ocean, and the Americas.
- **September 10 - Uranus at Opposition.** The blue-green planet will be at its closest approach to Earth. This is the best time to view Neptune, although it will only appear as a tiny blue-green dot in all but the most pow-

erful telescopes.

- **September 11 - Partial Solar Eclipse.** The partial eclipse will be visible throughout most of central and southern South America.
- **September 23 – First Day of Fall.** The Autumnal Equinox in the northern hemisphere occurs at 09:51 UT. There will be equal amounts of day and night.
- **December 22 – First Day of Winter.** The Winter Solstice in the northern hemisphere occurs at 06:08 UT. The Sun is at its lowest point in the sky and it will be the shortest day of the year.
- **December 24 - Mars at Opposition.** The red planet will be at its closest approach to Earth and its face will be fully illuminated by the Sun. This is the best time to view and photograph Mars.
